



What to Know

Everyone is getting super excited about this year's Teens of Praise church camp. We want you or your group to be a part of this awesome experience! Teens of Praise camp runs concurrently with Mount of Praise camp. What this means is that the teens will have their own morning worship service and activities throughout the day. In the evening, the teen campers will join with the adults in the main worship service. TOP is for students finishing 6th – 12th grades. Boys stay in bunk style housing at the Teen Complex. Girls stay in the college dorm rooms (girls don't seem to mind the housing inequity). There will be separate middle and high school dorms for the boys. Roommate requests can be made, but not guaranteed. The teen-only services are in the College Church chapel. All meals are in the college cafeteria. If weather permits, everyone will participate in afternoon outdoor activities Wednesday through Saturday. Contact the camp director if you are interested in being a counselor.

DATES & COST: **June 21-26, 2016**. Only **\$100** for early (before **June 1**) registrations

REGISTRATION: Mail all forms with payment to address on registration form.
Cost goes up to \$125 for registrations mailed after June 1st.
If less than a week before camp, call Camp Director for instructions on how to register.

CAMP BEGINS: Check-in is on **Tuesday, 4-5pm** @ the **Complex** (in front of campground)

CAMP ENDS: **1Pm** on **Sunday**

CLOTHING: Modest length shorts and T-shirts are permitted most of the day.
Boys must wear jeans and collared shirt to evening worship service.
Girls must wear dress slacks or a shirt to evening worship service.
Tennis shoes are necessary for afternoon activities.
Girls must wear at least a one-piece suit if we go to a waterpark.
