

What to Know

It's time to get super excited about Teens of Praise. We want you or your group to be a part of this awesome experience! Teens of Praise camp runs concurrently with Mount of Praise camp. What this means is that the teens will have their own morning worship service and activities throughout the day. In the evening, the teen campers will join with the adults in the main worship service. TOP is for students finishing 6th – 12th grades. All teens stay in the campus dormitories. Roommate requests can be made, but not guaranteed. The teen-only services are in the College Church chapel. All meals are in the college cafeteria. If weather permits, everyone will participate in afternoon outdoor activities Wednesday through Saturday. On Thursday afternoon, we will be travelling off campus via buses and vans to a nearby park. On Friday, the campers will be participating in various work projects throughout the county and at our CCCU mission center in Columbus. We always need more adult help! REGISTRATION: Mail all forms with payment to address on registration form. If less than a week before camp, call Camp Director for instructions on how to register.

CAMP BEGINS: Check-in is on **Tuesday, 4-5pm**. Follow signs!

CAMP ENDS: **1Pm on Sunday**

CLOTHING: Modest length shorts and T-shirts are permitted most of the day.
Boys must wear jeans and collared shirt to evening worship service.
Girls must wear dress slacks or a skirt to evening worship service.
Tennis shoes are necessary for afternoon activities.
Girls must wear at least a one-piece suit for off-campus water activities.

WHAT TO BRING: Bedding, bathroom essentials, sunscreen, flashlight, Bible, pen, notepad, and money (optional) for snack shack.
